Institute, WV – The Agriculture & Natural Resources program area of West Virginia State University Extension invites you to a hands-on wreath-making workshop just in time for the holiday season. Participants will walk away with their own beautiful wreath or centerpiece. The workshops will take place Tuesday, December 4, at the WVSU Wilson University Union from 11:30-1:30, and also at the University's Economic Development Center (located at 1506 Kanawha Blvd. West) on Thursday, December 6, from 9:00-12:00.

“We want people to realize that the beautiful wreaths and centerpieces they see in stores can easily be made using their very own landscape greenery,” said Scott Byars, Program Leader for Agriculture & Natural Resources.

The workshops will focus on the ease and convenience of creating wreaths with greenery found right in your own back yard, a topic Byars has addressed in the organization's quarterly magazine, *Extension Matters*, as well as their television series of the same name which airs on Charleston's Library Television Network.

“It's easier than you may think to create a gorgeous wreath for a fraction of the cost that you'd pay in the stores,” added Matt Browning, Communications Specialist and host of the *Extension Matters* TV show. “And it's an opportunity to add a personal touch to your holiday season.”
